# **Summer Camp**

Summer camp can be a fun-filled, exciting time for both youth and adults with PWS. Knowing what camp



and at what age is best for <u>your</u> child is a decision that each parent/care provider needs to make. Camp can offer a week filled with activities, adventures, and social opportunities. It can also be a week where families (especially siblings) get a break from the monitoring and challenges that we all face.

Over the years, PWSA of WI, Inc. has compiled a list of some camps that parents and care providers of children and adults who have PWS have attended. If you have further questions, contact PWSA of WI, Inc.'s office toll free at 1-866-797-2947 or contact the camp directly. Everyone has different opinions and views. YOU need to make the final decision. Many camps fill up early so get the paper work in.

If your decision to attend camp is based on finances—or lack of, don't hesitate to apply for a scholarship! PWSA of WI Inc. sets aside funds each year to assist a child or adult attend camp. Any person with PWS living in WI, young or old is eligible. You must be a member of our organization to be a recipient. Membership scholarships are also available. **DEAD-LINE IS APRIL 1, 2012.** A copy of the application form is included on the next 2 pages or can be downloaded from our website (www.pwsaofwi.org).

**NOTE:** There is a week at Lion's Camp for young adults aged 18-25 with Mild Cognitive Disabilities. This year it is August 12-17, 2012. Families are encouraged to get more information on eligibility requirements by visiting the Lion's camp website at: **www.wisconsinlionscamp.com.**
